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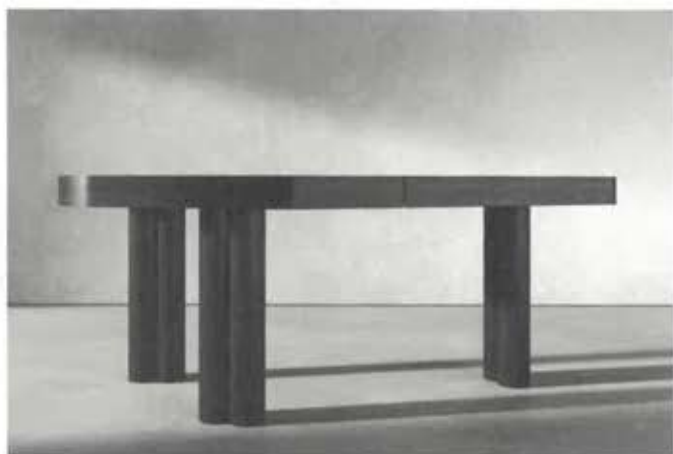
A MANIFESTO

For most people acquiring furniture designed by French maestro Pierre Yovanovitch was only ever a dream, as he created the often-quirky pieces for specific interior design projects. But with the launch of *Pierre Yovanovitch Mobilier*, a 45-piece collection of seating, lights, tables and accessories, the likes of his much-admired *Edgar* desk are now within reach. "It takes the quality and uncompromised attention to detail out of the context of a private residence or limited-edition gallery model and makes it available to a wider, global audience," says the designer who gave them names such as the *Flatiron* side table and *Mini Marsha* lamp.
